Australians live in a multicultural society with links all over the world. From business associates, friends, or family we all have some connection to another person or persons located overseas. A Carer's visa allows a non-Australian Citizen or non-Australian permanent resident to remain in Australia to care for a relative. You may have a relative whom you specifically need to provide you with care due to an illness or condition you suffer. We can help you and that relative apply for a carer's visa so they may be able to provide that ongoing care.

A 'remaining relative' is a person whose only close family ties are living in Australia. They need to have a reasonably close biological relationship to that Australian Citizen or permanent resident. That remaining relative may be able to apply for a Remaining Relative visa to reunite the family in Australia.

You may have an elderly relative who is financially dependent on you and has no other means to pay for their own living costs. They may qualify for an Aged Dependent Relative visa.
